From the Algarve, where your golf tournament ends, drive to Lisbon for two overnights, then embark the *Seabourn Sojourn*, and off we go. Through the Strait of Gibraltar, we dock in Cartagena, Spain, settled by the Carthaginian general Hasdrubal in 228 B.C. as a jump-off point for the conquest of Spain. Other Roman generals

would claim it until A.D. 298, when Emperor Diocletian founded a new Roman province, Carthagenensis, and set its capital in this city.

While we are in this port—and in any other port on our cruise—you are free to explore on your own or to sign up for a shore excursion (at additional cost). At every port, the choice is entirely your own.

On to Valencia. Originally a Greek settlement, the town was taken over by Romans in 138 BC and turned into a retirement town for old soldiers. Who came next? Visigoths, Moors, and El Cid.

To Mallorca, one of the Balearic Islands. Rome and Carthage battled over this territory, and portions of ancient Roman constructions remains.

The Balearic Island of Menorca is unique for its abundant prehistoric structures. The ancients who settled here likely also built Stonehenge in England. Imagine that.

us to Naples, Italy, in the shadow of mighty Mount Vesuvius. Trace the hairpin curves of the Amalfi Corniche. Cruise across the bay to fabled Capri. Shop for coral and cameos along Via Santa Lucia and in the Galleria Umberto. The possibilities here? Limitless.

sea before we anchor in Siracusa, Sicily, one of the most prestigious cities in the ancient world. Founded in the eighth century B.C. by settlers from Corinth, Siracusa gradually grew to rival Athens.

Valletta, Malta, next. Occupied by the Phoenicians, Greeks, Carthaginians, Romans, Arabs, French and British, Malta has always held strategic importance. While you're here, be sure to see what the Knights of St. John left behind, including St. John's Co-Cathedral and the Palace of the Grand Masters.

Trapani, also on Sicily, was founded by Phoenicians and thrived under Arab rule. It gained a reputation for its salt,

tuna, and coral and was known in the 16th century for the beautiful pieces produced by Trapanese coral artisans (see examples in the Pepoli Museum).

The Lipari Islands were created by volcanic eruptions thousands of years ago. Their primitive rocky beauty is absolutely stunning and quite unlike anything we've seen so far.

* Meals

All meals aboard the *Seabourn Sojourn* and breakfasts in Lisbon.

* Inclusions

Accommodations based on double occupancy; all ground transportation and transfers; all onboard meals and entertainment; all gratuities aboard ship; complimentary wine, spirits, French champagne, soft drinks, and mineral water aboard ship; complimentary in-suite dining; hotel taxes; baggage handling; tour development and planning; reservation management by R. * Exclusions

All reservations are subject to cancellation without notice if payments are not received by the due date and are finalized only when paid in full at 90 days prior to sailing. Reservations made within 90 days of sailing require full payment within one day of the reservation or sooner, as specified by Seabourn. Only U.S. dollar payments are accepted via agency check, personal check, Visa, MasterCard, Diner's Club, or Discover Card.

Expenses incurred for onboard services and products by the guest, or by Seabourn on behalf of the guest, shall be paid by the guest prior to disembarkation.

* Cancellations

Cancellations must be received by R. Crusoe & Son in writing. Cruise tickets must be returned to R. Crusoe & Son before a refund can be processed. Cancellations are subject

to the following forfeit as a percentage of tour cost: 90-46 days, 25 percent of tour cost; 45-31 days, 50 percent of tour cost; 30 days or less, 100 percent of tour cost; non appearance, 100 percent of tour cost.

The above penalties apply when the entire booking is cancelled and apply to all travel including cruise and land arrangements. If non-cruise components only are cancelled, the guest is responsible for any cancellation penalties imposed by the airlines, other transportation carriers, tour and ground operators, or hotel properties. A \$75 per person administrative fee applies to anyone wishing to change arrangements within 90 days of departure. Cancellation penalties may apply.

* Important Note

Under normal conditions, the cruise-only fare is guaranteed at the time of booking. However, the fare that you pay is determined far in advance of initial departure on the basis of then-existing projections for fuel and other costs. In the event of any significant change in such costs beyond our control, including but not limited to increases in the price of fuel, currency fluctuations affecting our costs, increases in government taxes or levies, or increased security costs, Seabourn reserves the right to surcharge passengers to cover such unexpected costs.
